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ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES

Landmark Christian Academy exists to assist parents in the God-given responsibility of educating their children and training them to love God first and to live productive, godly lives of service for His glory. Therefore, our administration and faculty strive for the following goals:

Should you desire to enroll a student at Landmark Christian Academy, please give special attention to the following admission procedures:

I. Schedule an Informational Visit

If you would like an informational visit and campus tour prior to submitting application forms, call our school office at 502.933.3000 to schedule a visit.

II. Registration

Submit to the school office a completed Student Enrollment Application with registration fee to begin the enrollment process.

III. Entrance Exam/Evaluation

Upon registration, an entrance exam is required for Grades 1-12. Entrance testing will be scheduled through the school office.

Applicants should bring a copy of their most recent report card or transcripts with them to their entrance exam appointment. Grade 6-12 applicants will also complete a Student Questionnaire at the time of the entrance exam. Grade 4-12 applicants and their parents will meet with administration during this entrance testing appointment.

IV. Enrollment Finalized

The applicant is officially enrolled when acceptance has been offered by the Administrator and when the following forms are submitted to the school office:

- A. Documented Kentucky Certificate of Immunization & Preventative Health Care Examination Form **or** a Kentucky Certificate of Religious Exemption.
- B. Copy of the applicant's birth certificate.
- C. Completed Responsible Financial Party Agreement in order to establish a tuition management plan.

Landmark Christian Academy admits students of any race, color, and national or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. LCA does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national or ethnic origin in administration of its educational policies, admission policies, athletics, and other school-controlled programs. However, selection of students is based upon openings in the particular grade levels, and entrance test, and an interview with administration. Family life, academic performance, and general behavior are also considered.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Are you accredited?

LCA began in 1978 and is a member of the American Association of Christian Schools and the Tennessee Association of Christian Schools. Landmark Christian Academy holds a full accreditation status by the American Association of Christian Schools and is certified by the Kentucky Non-Public School Commission.

2. What is the enrollment?

LCA has approximately 175 students, in three-year-old Kindergarten through twelfth grade.

3. What is the average class size?

A low average class size of 12 students allows teachers to show individual care and attention for each student.

4. Do you have extended care before and after school?

Yes, ESD (Extended School Day) is available before school beginning at 7:00 a.m. and after school from 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. ESD is billed monthly, based on the specific number of hours used during each month.

5. Are your students required to wear uniforms?

Yes, LCA's dress code consists of a pants/skirt and shirt uniform. A school uniform avoids confusion about permissible school dress, allows our students to look sharp in appearance, and diminishes students' concern and comparison of clothing.

6. How much "religion" is taught? Do all students take Bible?

Our goal is to ensure that every student knows Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and desires to obey Him with their lives. Our Bible program is a vital part in this goal becoming a reality. Bible is integrated into all subject areas in each grade level. Students have daily Bible classroom instruction and attend chapel once a week.

7. What credentials do your teachers have?

From Kindergarten through 12th grade, the faculty members of LCA have a minimum of a Bachelor's degree in their teaching field, and some have a Master's degree as well. Our teachers are also certified through the American Association of Christian Schools.

8. Are you affiliated with a church?

LCA is a ministry of Landmark Baptist Church. However, LCA has many other area churches represented in our student body.
