

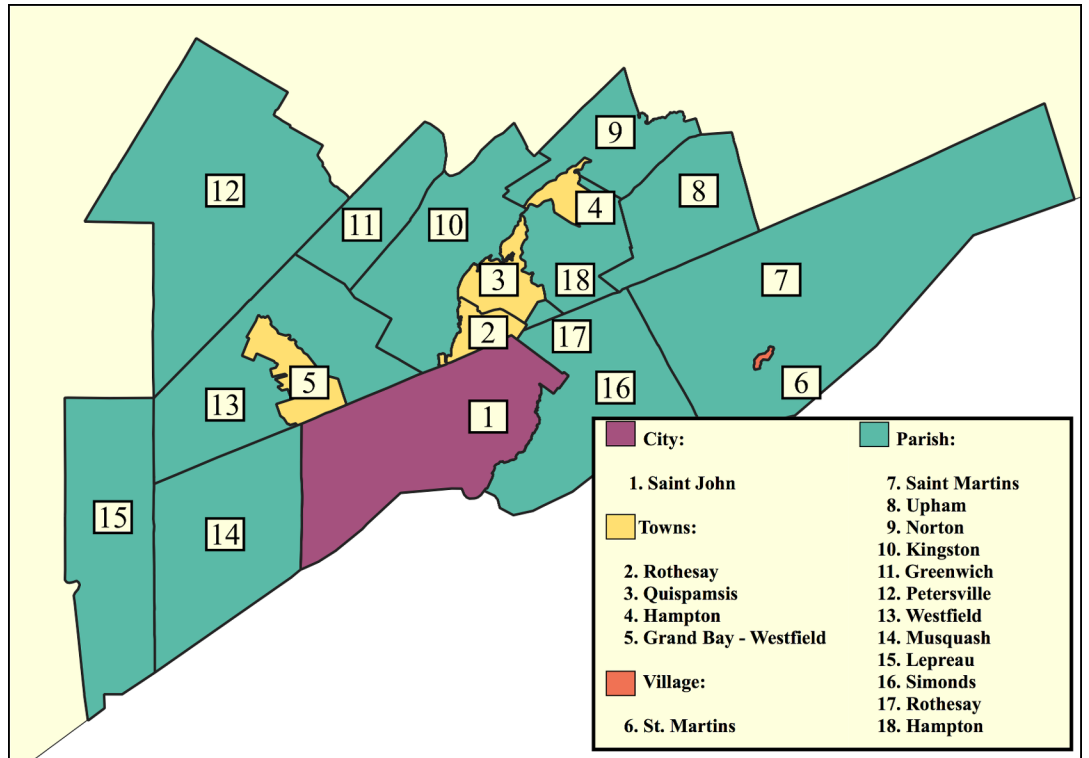

Saint John Census Metropolitan Area

What is a "CMA"?

- A census metropolitan area (CMA) is formed by one or more municipalities surrounding a population centre (known as the core - in this case the city of Saint John)
- A CMA has a total population of at least 100,000 residents; 50,000 or more must live in the core
- The Saint John CMA includes the towns of Rothesay, Quispamsis, Grand Bay - Westfield and Hampton, along with their surrounding villages and parishes
